More than 70 artists will be represented at the annual spring show of the Left Bank Art League June 6 and 7.

The show will be set up in Riverside park, 34th Street and 5th Avenue, Moline, near the Garden Center in the park, where the league holds its monthly meetings.

"There's a wide variety of things in the show," says Karen Schmidt, publicity chairman. There are oils, pastels and watercolors; hand-made jewelry; pottery; stoneware; and photography, for example.

Admission to the show is free. Artists pay for spaces in the juried show, and art work is for sale.

"You'll find some really nice things, such as pottery and stoneware. There's a blind basket weaver who does beautiful work," Schmidt says.

Many of the artists who will show their work are from the Quad-Cities, but there are also invited artists from five states. It is the largest art show in the Illinois Quad-Cities.

The league also holds a fall show for members only.

The Left Bank Art League was begun in 1956 by a group headed by Leon Eugene Wright. It meets every fourth Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. at the Garden Center.

Anyone who is interested in the arts is invited to join.
